The ubiquity of cults and cultic movements

Aum Shinrikyô was (is!) a paradigmatic textbook example for an extremist religious cult and will serve as a backdrop for my descriptions of cultic movements. These do not necessarliy have to be religious. Nowadays they come in the disguise of self-improvement, psychotherapy, lifestyle-counseling, coaching for more happiness, fitness and beauty seminars or even investment scams. It is important to understand the structure, characteristics, practices, interactional processes and thought-reform programs regarding cultic phenomena. Although realistically no one is immune to cults, one can inoculate oneself by becoming able toidentify the most important warning signs.

The transformation of the Japanese criminal underworld

*Begnning with the heyday of the old-school 'boryokudan' in the post-world war II period up to their commercial prosperity during the "bubble ecomonomy" (late 1980s) I want to outline the development of Japanese organized crime from small local gangs to hegemonic, large-scale semi-official enterprises. The enactment of the "Anti-boryokudan-law" in 1992 was a watershed and led to harsh repression instead of laissez-faire and a fatal decline of the criminal institutions. In their stead however, new loosely knit, (inter)network-based groups (*hangure* or *tokuryû*) dominate crime and wire transfer frauds in the cyberspace and even replace the Boryokudan in the nightlife districts as a brutal protection force. It is a generational and structural change of tectonic dimensions.



Wolfgang Herbert, born in the Alps of Western Austria, studied philosophy, comparative religious studies, (criminal) sociology and Japanese studies at the University of Vienna 1979-1993 (PhD), lives permanently in Japan (Kansai & Shikoku)) since 1992; Professor for Comparative Cultural Studies at the University of Tokushima since 2013, Visiting Professor i.a. in Vienna, Berlin and Cambridge.
