

Osaka's central location and excellent transportation network make it incredibly convenient to access nearby cities and their cultural and historical gems.





Course Guide

Course Period:

Winter 1: Wednesday, January 14, 2026 - Friday, February 6, 2026 (24 days) Winter 2: Thursday, February 12, 2026 - Thursday, February 26, 2026 (15 days)

Campus:

Kansai University, Minami-Senri International Plaza (1-2-20, Satakedai, Suita-shi, Osaka)

Eligible Participants:

Students who have foreign nationality and are enrolled in a college or university, or those who have graduated from college or university within one year of starting the course

Qualifications Required:

- Ability to read and write Hiragana and Katakana
- Ability to type in Japanese language
- · Ability to give a simple self-introduction and to explain one's daily schedule
- Those who have studied Japanese for at least 50 hours.

Course Content: All classes are conducted in Japanese.

- · Japanese language classes
- · Japanese culture experience
- Field trip
- Interaction with Kansai University students
- Presentation in Japanese
 - *The contents of Japanese culture experience and field trip are subject to change.

Features:

- Conversation Partners
 - Kansai University students support the class as conversation partners, allowing you to practice and improve your Japanese conversation skills.
- Cultural Exchange Opportunities

 Through interaction with Kansai University students, you can make friends in Japan.
- Enhancement of Presentation Skill
 By preparing for the final presentation, you will aim to improve your presentation skills in Japanese.

Capacity:

The course will be limited to **45 students** in principle.

- As a general rule, applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
 Therefore, registration may close once the capacity is reached, even before the application deadline.
 - If you wish to be placed on the waiting list after registration has closed, please register using the URL or QR code provided in "Application Procedure" \rightarrow "STEP 1".
- About 10 to 12 students per class
- When applying on a university basis, the number of students will be limited to approximately 5 to 10 students per university. The number of participants accepted from each university may be adjusted depending on the number of applicants.
- Minimum number of students: If the number of students is less than 10 for each class, classes will not be held.

Completion Requirements, Certificate of Completion:

Only participants who have attended at least 80% of all classes and activities from the Opening Ceremony to the Closing Ceremony will receive a certificate of completion. Upon completion of the course, participants will receive a certificate of completion* (original) and a transcript (electronic version), but no credits will be awarded by Kansai University.



Class:

Primary Class:

If you have not reached the level of ability listed in ①②③ below, you will not be able to apply for the course because we have not set up a class for you to participate in. Please check them carefully.

- ① Ability to read and write Hiragana and Katakana
- ② Ability to type in Japanese language
- 3 Ability to understand basic Japanese language

(This class is equivalent to JLPT N5 level *. Lower primary level)

Reference: Textbooks: "Marugoto: Japanese language and culture Starter A1 Coursebook for communicative language activities" and "Tsunagu Nihongo" Beginner Level Series vol.1"

- <Reading> One is able to read and understand typical expressions and sentences written in Hiragana, Katakana, and basic Kanji used in daily life.
- <Listening> One is able to listen and comprehend conversations about topics regularly encountered in daily life and classroom situations, and is able to pick up necessary information from short conversations spoken slowly.

Primary-Intermediate Class:

This class is for participants who can understand and mostly use basic Japanese.

(This class is equivalent to JLPT N4 - N3 level*. Higher primary level.)

Intermediate-Advanced Class:

This class is for participants who have advanced to the intermediate level of Japanese language and have the ability to communicate in basic Japanese.

(This class is equivalent to JLPT N2* or higher.)

Overseas travel accident insurance:



Payment of Course Fees:



- Accepted students will receive an email with guidelines for payment of fees after the application period is closed.
- Pay the required fees to the designated bank account in Japanese YEN by the deadline.
- A money transfer from outside of Japan may take time.
- Be sure to make the payment well in advance so that it will be completed by the deadline.
- As a rule, the fees once paid, will not be refunded.

Visa:

Students are responsible for obtaining the Visa. We will prepare and send them documents required for visa application after confirming the payment of the fees. If students are unable to obtain a visa, they will not be able to participate in the course. Be sure to consult the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan website for more information before applying for the course.

- 1 lunch and 2 dinners.

Transportation routes and travel time to the accommodation

There is no pick-up bus or other transportation service provided by Kansai University between the airport and your accommodation, so please make your own way to and from the airport.

To locate your accommodation, please refer to the URL listed under "dormitory details" in the section on titled "Accommodation Information". It is recommended to book a flight that arrives at Kansai International Airport no later than 12:00 p.m.

Arrival Time on the Day of Arrival

(Arrival day = the day before the opening ceremony)

- Please be punctual.
 - *Please review the schedule carefully.
- You are required to attend the orientation for your respective accommodation (dormitory or homestay). Attendance is mandatory.
 - ① Dormitory accommodation: Arrive at your designated dormitory by 3:00 PM (JST)
 - ② Homestay accommodation: Arrive at the following location by 4:00 PM (JST)

 - *After the orientation, you will go to your host family's house with them.

STEP2 Send the application documents 12 by email to ijlc@ml.kandai.jp

- 1 The certification document that verifies your enrollment status or the educational institution you graduated from. (One of the following documents will suffice.)
 - A scanned copy of both sides of the student ID card (with the expiration date clearly indicated)
 - A scanned copy of Certificate of Enrollment or Certificate of Graduation
- ② A scanned copy of passport ID page with your photo

Note: When sending an e-mail, please be sure to include your name. Please be careful not to make a mistake when sending personal information.

Application Completed

After submitting both STEP 1 and STEP 2, if there are any issues, we will contact you via email, so please be sure to check your email regularly. After both submissions are complete, you will receive an email with the receipt of your application and information on taking the placement test from the Center for International Education, Kansai University within a week.

If you do not receive any communication within a week of submitting the STEP 2 application documents (by email), please contact ijlc@ml.kandai.jp.

Take a Placement Test

- Students must complete on their own without referring to texts or other materials.
- · An online interview may be conducted beforehand. In such cases, only the relevant individuals will be contacted via email.
- This test is used only as a reference for class placement.
- The score of the test result is not available to applicants.

Application period

The application is complete once both the online registration and the submission of documents are received.
