- 3. To have strong willingness to study proactively in one of the programs of foreign language education, intercultural communication, and interpretation and translation studies.

#### Ph.D. Degree Program

#### 1. Qualification

Applicants shall satisfy one of the following  $(1)\sim(5)$  conditions:

(including applicants who are expected to satisfy one of the following (1) $\sim$ (4) conditions before enrolling at the Graduate School)

- (1) Applicants who have completed a regular 16-year program of school education outside Japan (Note 1).
- (2) Applicants who have graduated from Japanese universities as international students.
- (3) Persons who have completed a 3-year program or a program of more than 3 years and have been awarded a degree by an overseas university or school (Note 2) which is recognized as being equivalent to a bachelor's degree.
  - (the 2016 ordinance of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, No. 19)
- (4) Applicants who have completed Specialized Course at Japanese special training schools after the designated date by the minister of MEXT<sup>†</sup> as international students. The training schools must satisfy the conditions designated by MEXT including that the length of term required for graduation be at least four years.
  - † MEXT; Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology
- (5) Applicants who are recognized as having scholastic abilities equivalent or superior to the graduates of university through Pre-qualification Individual Screening for Entrance Examination of the Graduate School. (This requirement shall not apply to the foreigners who are recognized as having received Japanese regular school education program.)

### Remote Learning System [For Master's Degree Program]

In order to better meet the diverse needs of enrollees in our master's program and to expand opportunities for learning and research, the Graduate School of Foreign Language Education has set up a remote learning system for the fields of Foreign Language Education (English language research only) and Translation and Interpreting Studies.

It is therefore possible for students who find commuting to university difficult due to work commitments or because they live far away to complete their master's degree program by taking courses online.

In addition to the standard two-year course, students can also complete the three-year course using the remote learning system. However, it is not possible to complete the Aston DD Program and the Japanese Language Education Specialist Training Course online because they include face-to-face classes.

Students who use the remote learning system can take classes from their home or workplace using an Internet-based application. Most classes can be taken remotely, with a few exceptions due to the nature of the content of the classes. Even the final exam (oral examination) can be taken remotely.

There is no special entrance exam for those who wish to use the remote enrolment system. Instead, selection will be made using the existing (face-to-face) entrance examination. No quota is set for the remote learning system.

Use of the remote learning system is limited to people residing in Japan. Please obtain permission from your preferred academic supervisor before applying. If no signature is written in the "Academic supervisor's signature regarding the remote learning system" column in your "Statement of Reasons for Applying", you will not be able to use this system. If you are unable to obtain your preferred adviser's signature because of distance, please contact the Kansai University Graduate School Admissions Division in advance.

## **Extended Enrollment System**

In order to better meet the diverse needs of enrollees and expand opportunities for graduate-level learning and research, the Graduate Schools of Law, Letters, Informatics, Foreign Language Education and Research, Psychology (Psychology Major), East Asian Cultures, Governance, Health and Well-being offer a three-year course, in addition to the standard two-year Master's Degree Program. #### (2) Assignment of Classes by Year for the Three-year Course

#### (3) Changing Courses after Enrollment

At the time enrollees become second-year students, they can request to switch from the three-year course to the two-year course if they satisfy the following conditions as designated by each Graduate School. If they do so, at the Graduate Schools of Law, Informatics, Psychology (Psychology Major), Governance, the course limit of their second-year will be 28 credits, and at the Graduate Schools of Letters, Foreign Language Education and Research, East Asian Cultures, Health and Well-being, the course limit of their second-year will be 30 credits.

Eligible students will be notified during the fall semester of their first-year (Enrollees from the fall semester: spring semester of their first-year) by the University's Information System. Please note that it is impossible to switch from the two-year course to the three-year course.

#### (4) Limit of Years Enrolled

Limit of years enrolled for both the two-year course and three-year course is 4 years.

#### (5) Graduation Requirements

The graduate requirements are the same for both the two-year and three-year courses. Students enrolled in the three-year course shall take three years to complete the same requirements as students enrolled in the two-year course. #### (6) School Fees

## Remote Learning System [For Ph.D. Degree Program]

In order to better meet the diverse needs of enrollees in our Ph.D. program and to expand opportunities for learning and research, the Graduate School of Foreign Language Education has set up a remote learning system.

It is therefore possible for students who find commuting to university difficult due to work commitments or because they live far away to complete their Ph.D. degree program by taking courses online. However, it is not possible to complete the Japanese Language Education Specialist Training Course online because it includes face-to-face classes.

Students who use the remote learning system can take classes from their home or workplace using an Internet-based application. Most classes can be taken remotely, with a few exceptions due to the nature of the content of the classes. Even the basic research ability test (QE), the hearing session, and the final exam (oral examination) can be taken remotely.

There is no special entrance exam for those who wish to use the remote enrolment system. Instead, selection will be made using the existing (face-to-face) entrance examination. No quota is set for the remote learning system.

Use of the remote learning system is limited to people residing in Japan. Please obtain permission from your preferred academic supervisor before applying. If no signature is written in the "Academic supervisor's signature regarding the remote learning system" column in your "Statement of Reasons for Applying", you will not be able to use this system. If you are unable to obtain your preferred adviser's signature because of distance, please contact the Kansai University Graduate School Admissions Division in advance.

For those who live abroad and are exempted from the (foreign language) written examination, the entrance examination (oral examination) will be conducted remotely.
