International academic exchange is promoted through initiatives such as creating the Program for EU-Japanology Education and Research (PEJER) as a minor and Implementing a double-degree program with Yeungnam University in South Korea. Since students are expected to publish papers in academic journals and present at academic conferences while enrolled in the graduate school, it's necessary to broaden their knowledge by including lectures from other programs in addition to their own specialization. This graduate school offers a diverse range of programs covering all fields of the humanities and provides detailed support for study and research.

This graduate school specializes in training experts in foreign language education and foreign language professionals. The master's program offers three areas of study: Foreign Language Teaching, which focuses on systematic and comprehensive learning applicable to practice; intercultural Communication Studies, which explores topics through an interdisciplinary approach; and Interpreting and Translation Studies, which pursues both practice and education. The doctoral program focuses on the full-scale development of researchers in foreign language education. The school also promotes international academic exchange through initiatives such as a double-degree program with Yeungnam University in South Korea and Aston University in the United Kinadom.

Graduate School of Psychology

[Master's Degree Program] Psychology Major / Clinical Psychology Major [Ph.D. Degree Program] Psychology Major

The Psychology Major offers a comprehensive education based on five areas (Cognitive and Physiological Psychology, Social and Industrial Psychology, Developmental and Educational Psychology, Health and Personality Psychology, and Quantitative and Methodological Psychology) with a strong emphasis on developing research skills and fostering individuals capable of contributing to solving various issues in the field. The Clinical Psychology Major is designed to train professionals who can actively work as licensed psychologists. In addition to developing practical skills, the curriculum is designed to foster the ability to apply scientifically grounded practices and to equip students with research skills necessary for research and development in clinical psychology and related fields.

Graduate School of Societal Safety Sciences

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Disaster Prevention and Reduction Major

To realize a safe and secure society, it's necessary to establish a new interdisciplinary field of social safety studies that integrates the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences. This graduate school is committed to accumulating and systematizing safety-related knowledge while fostering the ability to explore disaster prevention and mitigation measures, accident prevention, and crisis management through multifaceted and comprehensive approaches, and to create theories and policies. Additionally, the school has also launched an English-taught doctoral program, the Ph.D. of Disaster Management Program (PDM).

Graduate School of East Asian Cultures

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Cultural Interaction Studies

Under the Department of Cultural Interaction Studies, three domains of study (East Asian Languages and Visual Representation, East Asian Thought and Organization, and East Asian History and Dynamics) have been established to explore the diverse forms of cultural exchange and interaction in the region with the goal of becoming an international research hub for East Asian culture. Additionally, while promoting international academic exchange through initiatives such as the East Asia Next-Generation Forum, where graduate students from Japan, China, and South Korea present their research findings, and a double-degree program with Yeungnam University in Korea, the program cultivates methods for comprehending the entirety of cultural interaction in East Asia and fosters perspectives that recognize East Asia as a chain of diverse cultural contacts that transcend national borders.

Graduate School of Governance

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Governance Major

The program aims to cultivate highly skilled public professionals with the ability to identify issues, design policies as solutions, and implement them. Education and research are carried out with a focus on political science, public administration, and law, fostering collaboration across these disciplines. Students address issues such as regional environmental development, the socioeconomic advancement of Asian societies, and regional ervitalization policies as they engage in interdisciplinary and multifaceted learning while tackling more practical policy challenges.

Graduate School of Health and Well-being

While valuing the harmony of mind, body, and lifestyle, the program is designed not only to enhance athletic performance, but also to achieve health and well-being through physical activity and welfare-related social work. It's committed to developing human resources equipped with broad perspectives and practical skills, including highly specialized professionals who will pursue community-based health and life support work, leaders of citizen activities such as NPOs and NGOs, and researchers who will integrate sports and welfare as they address social issues.

Established in April 2004, the program is designed to train legal professionals with a pronounced sense of humanity and commitment to address contemporary social issues. It produces legal experts who balance theory and practice, possess outstanding human rights awareness, demonstrate creativity in responding appropriately to emerging issues, and are capable of leading the evolving legal society with a global perspective.

School of Accountancy (School of Accountancy Accountant Training Major)

As accounting and auditing systems are being revised to meet global standards, Japan's certified public accountants are increasingly expected to perform at an international level. The primary mission of our School of Accountancy is to cultivate accounting professionals who are well-versed in both theory and practice and capable of succeeding on the world stage. Eligibility for applicants (September applications • November applications)

All conditions (1) to (4) below must be met to apply for the entrance examination.

(1) Applicants who must be of foreign nationality.

- (2) Applicants who satisfy any one of conditions [1] through [6] below and who have completed at least two-thirds of a 12-year curriculum in a country other than Japan (see Note 1), or applicants who satisfy condition [7] below
 - Note 1: Applicants who attended a foreign school in Japan or a Japanese school program in another country will be treated as if they had attended school in Japan for the duration of their enrollment. Students who graduated from a high school or secondary school in Japan only (or who expect to do so) are not eligible to take the examination.
- Applicants who have completed a 12-year schooling as part of a normal curriculum in a country other than Japan, or who expect to have done so by March 31, 2026

Note 2: Meaning applicants who have studied in a country other than Japan for at least two-thirds of the total period of 12 years, less the period shortened due to grade-skipping or otherwise. This includes those who completed the 12th year of a program in less than 12 years by skipping grades, or otherwise.

- [2] Applicants who have passed an examination in another country that certifies them as having knowledge equivalent to someone who has completed a 12-year educational curriculum in that country (including examinations that satisfy national standards) and who will be 18 years of age by March 31, 2026
- [3] Applicants who have completed the secondary curriculum in a country that does not require 12 years of study and who have completed a course designed to prepare students for admission to a Japanese university as designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, or who expect to have done so by March 31, 2026 Note 3: Meaning applicants who spent at least two-thirds of the duration of their secondary education outside Japan.
- [4] Applicants who have completed a program of study at a school equivalent to high school that qualifies as the equivalent of at least 11 years of education as designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in a country other than Japan, or who expect to have done so by March 31, 2026 Note 4: Meaning applicants who spent at least two-thirds of the duration of their study in a high-school-equivalent program outside Japan.
- [5] Applicants who have earned an internationally recognized qualification that entitles them to attend university (International Baccalaureate, Abitur, Baccalaureate, GCEA level, International A-levels, European Baccalaureate) in a country other than Japan
- [6] Applicants who have completed a 12-year program of study at an educational facility in a country other than Japan that has earned certification for educational and related activities from an international evaluation organization (WASC, CIS, ACSI, NEASC, Cognia, COBIS)
- [7] Applicants who have been certified by the University's Undergraduate Faculty Council as having qualifications equivalent or superior to those described in conditions [1] through [6] above, and who will be 18 years of age by March 31, 2026

(1) Applicants who must be of foreign nationality and have completed 12 years of schooling up to high school in countries other than Japan.

- (2) Applicants who satisfy any of the following conditions. Applicants who have completed a regular 14-year schooling in foreign countries. (Applicants expecting adequate qualifications by the end of March, 2026 are eligible).
- Applicants who will have been registered at a four-year university in Japan for at least two years by the end of March 2026 (excluding periods of leave of absence) and have obtained at least 60 of the credits required for graduation from the faculty and department concerned (including applicants expecting adequate qualifications).
- Graduates of a four-year university, junior college or tertiary college in Japan (Applicants expecting adequate qualifications by the end of March 2026 are eligible).


Scholarships from outside sources (awarded based on the recommendation of the University)



For this reason, I want to become not only a researcher, but also a speaker who can persuade politicians and the public in order to implement national projects that utilize tax revenues more efficiently. To that end, I believe it's important to further enhance my research skills, develop a diverse network of contacts, and gain experience in advanced models of collaboration between research institutions and government agencies. Bearing this in mind, I'm preparing to pursue research in the U.S. after graduating from Kansai University.

Finally, Kansai University offers a variety of programs to support international students in their job-hunting activities. Knowing that there are many alumni who are active in various fields offers motivation and reassurance during your study abroad experience.

The common liberal arts courses taken from the first year let you broaden your perspective by taking classes alongside students from different faculties.

In the Faculty of Economics, where I belong, students are free to choose courses according to their interests, ranging from basic subjects such as microeconomics and macroeconomics, which form the foundation of economics, to fields that analyze the trends of industries and companies, and even international economics, where you can learn in depth about the economic conditions of various countries. One course I found particularly interesting is Economic Development Theory. It not only covers theoretical aspects of economics, but also focuses on the current economic situation, facilitating an in-depth study of developing nations' economies and unique challenges.

Extracurricular activities are also extremely fulfilling, with many opportunities both on and off campus to broaden your interests and skills. Since my first year, I've actively participated in "KU Bridge" events, which bring Japanese and international students together. These events are held on campus and can be attended during free periods or after classes, allowing for efficient use of time and making it easy to participate. Through these activities, I've been able to interact with Japanese students and international students while gaining valuable experience and a deep understanding different cultures and values.

I'm currently receiving two scholarships. One is a Kansai University scholarship for privately-financed international students, and the other is an outside scholarship from the Takeo Yamamoto Memorial Scholarship Fund. The university's Division of International Affairs provides extensive information about scholarships for international students, helping them apply and offering detailed assistance so that each student can focus on their studies.

In the future, I hope to help create a more livable society in my home country, Indonesia, by supporting the development of sustainable infrastructure to underpin the nation's economy. Living in Japan, I've experienced firsthand how well-developed infrastructure leads to a comfortable living environment, which in turn greatly contributes to economic growth. This realization has inspired me to study broad economic theories and acquire practical knowledge in order to promote infrastructure development in my own country
