

Cost of living



- 1. Copy of passport
- 2. Two recommendation letters from professors
- 3. Copy of transcript from home university
- 4. Proof of health insurance coverage

6. Certificate of English level (B2)



Minimum language requirement

Spanish is desired, but not mandatory. If courses taught in English are chosen, students must render a certificate of English level B2.



Visa procedures

Students from non-restricted countries, applying for one semester, do not need a student visa. Students applying for more than one semester and students from restricted countries should visit the closest Mexican Consulate or Embassy to apply for a student visa. More information here.
