About The Program: Explore Your Future in Japan - OSIP Short-term Career Development Program

Are you a university student interested in building a career in Japan? The OSIP Short-term Career Development Program at Kansai University offers a dynamic 7-day experience that brings together international and Japanese students to explore career possibilities in a global context. Before arriving in Osaka, participants join an online session and complete an on-demand course on career development in Japan. On-site, the program kicks off with a warm welcome, campus tour, and ice-breaking activities, followed by interactive, project-based workshops on team building, cross-cultural communication, and essential workplace skills.

A key highlight is a corporate visit to a Japanese company, providing firsthand insight into local work culture and opportunities to connect with professionals. The week concludes with a cultural exchange and group reflection. In just one week, you'll gain valuable skills, expand your global mindset, and take a meaningful step toward your future. Cost

Program Fees and Accommodation Options

- Program Participation Fee: ¥70,000
- Accommodation Options:
 - Homestay (private room with 2 meals per day): ¥55,000
 - Homestay (shared room with 2 meals per day): ¥45,000
- You may also choose to arrange your own accommodation (e.g., hotel). Kansai University can recommend hotels within commuting distance of the campus. Please note that accommodation arrangements and reservations should be made individually.



Overseas Travel Accident Insurance

All participants are required to purchase the overseas travel accident insurance specified by Kansai University. This insurance is included in the program fees.

- This insurance does NOT cover pre-existing conditions (including allergies) or damage to personal belongings.
- The insurance is valid only for a specific period—from the check-in to the check-out day. Any period outside the official program schedule is not covered.
- If you require additional coverage beyond what is provided, you will need to purchase it at your own expense.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be undergraduate or graduate students currently enrolled at an accredited college, university, or research institution outside Japan.
- English proficiency sufficient for basic communication (CEFR level B1 or above recommended)
- No Japanese language ability required

- 【Step1.】 Coordinator Application:** September 10 – October 2, 2026
- 【Step2.】 Student Application Deadline:** October 16, 2026

*Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Please note that applications will close once capacity is reached.

*A minimum of 10 participants is required for the program to be held.

For University Coordinators Only

- Complete your application and upload the required documents.

After your university coordinator completes Step 1, you will receive the URL for KU Gate (Kansai University's online application system for short-term programs) from your university coordinator. How to Apply via KU Gate

① Create a KU Gate Account



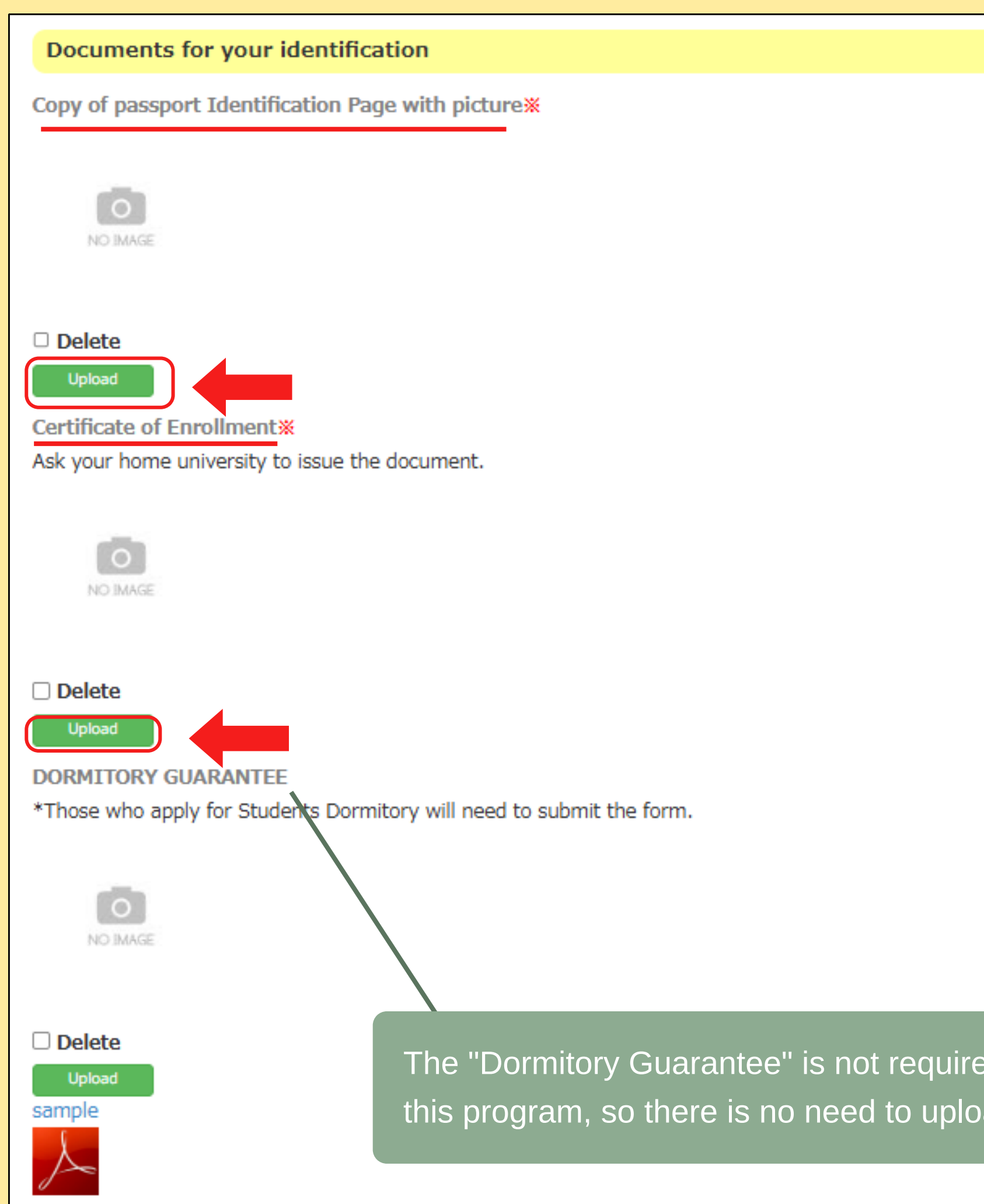
1. Access the "Application Form" from the website and click "If this is your first time logging in, please create an account."
2. Enter your email address twice and click the "Register" button.
3. You will receive an email from KU Gate. Please click the [URL for authentication] in the email to complete your account registration.
4. Enter your Family Name, Given Name, and Middle Name, then click "Register" to complete your registration.

② Complete the Application Form



1. Click "OSIP Program."
2. Click the "Apply" button at the bottom of the page.
3. Please fill in all required information displayed on the screen.

③ Upload Required Documents



In the "Documents" section, please upload the following required documents:

- A copy of your passport photo page
- Certificate of Enrollment*

*Please submit an official certificate of enrollment, issued by your home institution, written in English along with your passport copy. This certificate should confirm that you are currently enrolled at the time of your application for OSIP. Ideally, it should include the dates of your program's commencement and expected completion.

Please make sure that the file titles of your passport copy and certificate of enrollment are labeled with your full name (as it appears on your passport).

Once you have uploaded all the required documents, check the box for "I agree with the Use of My Personal Information/the Terms and Conditions of Use," and complete your application.



→ Step 3. Result and Payment

Result Notification

Application documents will be reviewed, and applicants will be notified of the results through KU Gate. Successful applicants will also receive information regarding the payment process and other details. If you do not receive any notification within 20 days after submitting your application, please contact us immediately.

Payment

- Please follow the instructions and transfer the fees stated in the invoice to the designated bank account by the deadline.
- Remittance must be made in Japanese yen.
- International money transfers may take some time to be complete. Please ensure that you make the transfer well in advance to ensure payment is completed by the deadline.
- Applicants are responsible for any remittance fees.
- Kindly note that tuition and other fees are non-refundable once payment has been completed.

1. Pledge
2. Proof of Remittance



→ Step 4. Acceptance **By the end of November**

The acceptance letter will be uploaded on your KU Gate portal once we confirm the completion of your payment. If you do not find the acceptance letter by the end of November, despite having completed your payment, please contact us immediately.
